*This conference honours the late Dr. Jack S. Crawford, former Ophthalmologist-in-Chief for the Hospital for Sick Children, whose career was dedicated to advancing the specialty of pediatric ophthalmology and the care of children's eye problems.*

The 35th Annual Jack Crawford Day will focus on the theme **"Every Angle, Every Child: Recent Advances in Kinder Eye Care."** The day will include topics relevant to both pediatric and general eye specialists including pediatric refractive surgery, intrascleral fixation IOL in children with zonular deficiency, minimally invasive glaucoma surgery in children, tips and pearls from 42 years in strabismus practice, 2025 PEDIG

updates, virtual reality perimetry, anti-VEGF and systemic implications for ROP, pneumatic retinopexy and a few more.

**We welcome our Jack Crawford Lecturer, Dr. Stephen Kraft and international guest speakers, Dr. Sean Donahue and Dr. Manoj Parulekar.**

The overall goal of this program is to address current updates in pediatric ophthalmology, both medical and surgical. The audience will be presented with new concepts that may change and optimize management for children and their families. All subspecialty areas within pediatric ophthalmology will be covered, including pediatric cornea, cataract surgery, oculoplastics, glaucoma, myopia, strabismus, amblyopia, neuro-ophthalmology, retinopathy of prematurity, retinoblastoma, ocular genetics, and vitreoretinal surgery.

**At the conclusion of the meeting the attendee will:**

1. Gain knowledge on the recent trials conducted by the Pediatric Eye Disease Investigator Group (PEDIG), a collaborative network dedicated to facilitating multicenter research in strabismus and amblyopia.
2. Understand new concepts in the management of pediatric cataract, ptosis, myopia, optic neuritis, retinopathy of prematurity, genetic eye disease, and retinal detachment.
3. Review the history of strabismus surgery and surgical pearls to implement into clinical practice.
